

GLOBAL HEALTH EQUITY FOUNDATION TO HOST GLOBAL HEALTH LEADERS AT ITS 1ST INTERNATIONAL SYMPOSIUM IN GENEVA, SWITZERLAND

“Making Tangible Improvements Toward Global Health Equity: A Consensus Building Forum” will take place on May 19, 2010.

(SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA, US ~ May 17, 2010) -- Global Health Equity Foundation will be holding its first international symposium to coincide with the annual World Health Assembly, which begins today. The World Health Organization has made official recognition of Global Health Equity Foundation as the foundation welcomes its guest speaker representing the Department of Ethics, Trade, Human Rights and Health Law (ETH). The foundation is also supported with major representation from the International School for Communities, Rights and Inclusion (ISCRI), the Netherlands Bioinformatics Centre (NBIC), and Zurich University of Applied Sciences School of Management and Law.

“Making Tangible Improvements Toward Global Health Equity: A Consensus Building Forum” will be presented in collaboration with this esteemed group of international health leaders and researchers. Approximately twenty additional attendees will participate in interactive discussion forums focused on contemporary, critical issues facing the global health community, such as global health governance and providing health aid to displaced populations. The symposium provides the opportunity for Global Health Equity Foundation to apply its model for collaboration and consensus building. A “Declaration of Consensus” and an introductory “Report on Consensus Building Forums”, the first in a series of reports, will summarize the outcomes of the symposium and will be released to the press and posted on the foundation's website.

The symposium is sponsored by the Fondation Brocher, whose mission is to encourage pluridisciplinary thought on the ethical, legal and social implications for humankind of recent medical research and new medical technologies.
